Twenty-ten is history. It has slipped by quickly. There haven't been a lot of "knock-your-socks-off" improvements, such as new concrete or major leadership changes. Nonetheless, 2010 saw steady growth and consolidation for the Association.

We have had an orderly change of board members but maintained the continuity of our programs. We've introduced some younger blood into leadership positions. We have established stronger ties with some affiliated disc golf clubs.

We tried and failed to establish a new course in the Newberry Hill Heritage Park area, but not achieving our goal there may have been a blessing in disguise. Instead of fighting continued and complicated political battles, we may be able to take advantage of a new

opportunity. This winter, or early next spring, we hope to begin development of a new course on Waaga Way. It promises to be a challenging layout, but may be restricted to play for certain times of the year.

Several new events and competitions were introduced including the nationally recognized Ice Bowl, WBDGW World's Biggest Disc Golf Weekend, and the PDGA sanctioned Whiners in the Woods. Many members participated in the already established annual Senior Games, Bag Tag Challenge, and Fall Fling.

Remember that we need the support of all of you to make the West Sound Disc Golf Association a premier disc golf organization in Western Washington. Now that we're beginning a new year, it's time to renew your membership. The dues re-

main \$20. There are many good reasons to become a member. Your dues money goes toward the course improvements and activities. Your membership gives the Association cohesiveness and stability.

We now have concrete on both the red and blue tee boxes at the NAD course.

We've got new tee markers showing the direction and distance to the baskets. We've also added a new alternative pin placement for #16, to make that hole a bit more challenging. Volunteers have done prodigious work at the NAD recently, revamping the drainage and improving the trails.

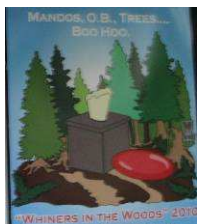

WBDGW World's Biggest Disc Golf Weekend May 1-2

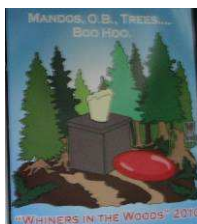

Players headed to Fredericksen Wilderness Park in Poulsbo for the afternoon. Sunday morning competition was held at the Kitsap County Fairgrounds and the afternoon event concluded at Van Zee Park in Port Orchard. There were more than fifty participants for this celebration!



Bag Tag Challenge May 8 - September 18

Sam Huff writes, "Thanks to all who supported the 2010 West Sound Bag Tag Challenge. The mission of the Bag Tag Challenge is to encourage friendly competition among the West Sound players by creating a format for individual play and a series of organized events to which the local players could compete in a group setting. Based on all the feedback throughout the year, the Bag Tag Challenge is meeting its goal of bringing the disc golf community together."

The season started May 8th and finished up on September 18th. Individual challenges were held throughout the season and group challenges scheduled on a weekly basis on Friday nights at NAD Park and a monthly event on Saturday at a variety of local courses. There were a total of thirty players who entered into the Bag Tag Challenge, which was fewer than last year, but the participation was far better. All five of the 'Monthlies' had at least 20 players. I looked forward to seeing the large group of players once a month for some semi-competitive disc golf. Individual challenges throughout the season were another part of the Bag Tag Challenge. It wasn't just about earning a top ten tag, but getting the lowest Bag Tag available amongst friends."



Whiners in the Woods May 15-17

Players from all over the Pacific Northwest, including a few pros and top-ranked PDGA stars, joined several of our local standouts in the PDGA-sanctioned tournament. Hosted by Paul Wright and Scott Papa, this first annual contest offered the players many challenges at the N.A.D. and Fairgrounds courses over the two days. \$600 in raffle proceeds were contributed to the WSDGA. For the fourth year, the Bremerton Senior Games included disc golf as an event. As commissioner, Cathy Cohoon oversaw the competition which included folks ranging in age from fifty to over seventy. Volunteers Dusty and DJ Nelson kept official scores for the men's group, while Jeff "Monty" Montgomery tallied for the 18-hole women's division. The West Sound Disc Golf Association is a tax exempt 501 (c)(3) organization and is chartered as a non-profit corporation in the state of Washington.
