How and when can I get started playing Disc Golf?

You can play disc golf all year round. No tee times required!

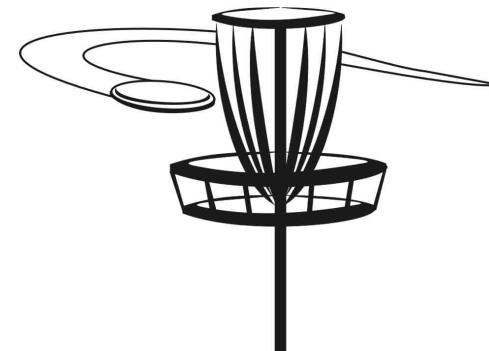
Every Saturday morning, you will find disc golfers at N.A.D. Park meeting for "Family Friendly Random Doubles." This is a great way to get started playing disc golf. Discs are available for loan and experienced players are happy to share their skills. Many of us have improved our games by seeing good players in action and by watching instructional videos on YouTube. Of course, as in any sport, practice helps too!

Many local sporting goods stores offer a selection of discs and beginner sets. 360 Disc Golf in Bremerton, the area Big 5 Sports stores, Sportsman's Warehouse, and Sport Haus in Poulsbo provide a variety of brands. Our local professional calls his internet outlet Hyzer Farm. As you become familiar with the brands and styles, and as your game improves, you'll find that your collection of discs will grow.

You CAN play with just ONE disc, but soon you'll have a favorite driver, midrange, and putter. Before you know it, you will be carrying a bag of discs for a variety of different shots. Prices range from about \$7 to \$20 or more for each disc. Lost and found boxes are available at each course and 360 Disc Golf handles the returns on behalf of the WSDGA.



What IS Disc Golf?



If you're familiar with regular ball golf, you're more than halfway to understanding the disc version. The discs are similar to the old-style Frisbee you threw when you were a kid, but they're much more compact and aerodynamic. Most players can fling one at least a couple hundred feet. The idea is to get your disc down the fairway and into a metal chain basket about two-hundred-fifty feet away from the tee box. Most of the holes on our local courses are par threes, which means you get three throws to get your disc into the basket. If you need four throws, that's a bogey. Five is a double-bogey, and so on. The person with the lowest number of throws at the end of eighteen holes is the winner.

Disc Golf is a sport in which people of all ages can participate. It will get you closer to nature than you've been in a while. It's great exercise and fun. There is nothing like hearing the clink of the chains when your disc hits that basket from thirty feet out!

Where can I play Disc Golf?



NAD Park

6002 Kitsap Way Bremerton WA 98312

Corner of Austin Drive & Kitsap Way, just off SR-3

This technical course winds through more than twenty acres of old growth forest offering the public a great disc golf experience and a beautiful Northwest nature walk. The course has been designed to offer a little something for everyone. Red and Blue tees will challenge the most advanced golfer and at the same time give the recreational golfer a fabulous course for the great sport of disc golf. There are two pin placements on most holes and baskets are moved every few months. The six hole Discovery course provides a beginner and practice venue.



Kitsap County Fairgrounds

West end of Gordon Field parking lot

This is a long, challenging course with fairways through the forest that include several elevation changes. Players will see a three-hundred-foot gliding descent shot followed up with an arm-wrenching uphill hole. It gets more interesting as you go. This highly technical course with holes on both sides of Fairgrounds Road, offers championship level competition. Hole one is located at the west end of the soccer field parking lot.



Van Zee Park

300 Tremont St Port Orchard WA 98366

Off Hwy 16, Exit at Tremont St. / Old Clifton Rd.

This wonderful city park course consists of rolling hills that are mostly wooded, along with some open areas, and is designed to be a recreational course with plenty of variety. Elevation changes and sloped greens provide players with a special degree of challenge. The park is easily accessible from both the upper and lower (paved) parking lots. First tee is by the playground.



The Bud Pell @ Ross Farm

Off Hwy 303 at ball golf driving range, park in upper lot

This a challenging 18 hole layout that includes farmland, woods, meadow, water hole, and rolling elevation. Thanks to the collaboration between the Ross family and Paul Wright, the course design is remarkable. The WSDGA is proud to honor Bud Pell's contributions to our disc golf community in this way. Blue teeboxes are for the "long" par 62 course, with one par 5, six par 4s, and ten par 3s. Red teeboxes make a "short" par 60course. The landowner says No night golf, No Smoking, No Alcohol and NO DOGS. Please cooperate so we maintain our welcome here!

Located on beautifully maintained Horseshoe Lake traditional ball golf course, there are lots of OBs. Ponds, cart paths and golf greens make for challenging rounds.
