Besides travel to other courses for PDGA tournaments, some of our members took road trips together this summer. In July, a group travelled to H.J. Carroll Park in Chimacum for a get acquainted random doubles event. In August, a large group of WSDGA members, trekked up to the course at the Crystal Mountain Ski Area for some mountain golf. They lost a total of 17 discs on the perilous descent down the mountain, but they found nearly an equal number that others had lost. Apparently, it was altitude with attitude.

Course Improvements



N.A.D.

We now have concrete on both the red and blue tee boxes at the N.A.D. park course, and we've got new tee markers showing the direction and distance to the baskets. We've also added a new alternative pin placement for #16, to make that hole a bit more challenging. Volunteers have done prodigious work at the N.A.D. park recently, revamping the drainage and improving the trails.



Fairgrounds

The last nine tee pads were finished and now there are concrete tee boxes on all eighteen holes at the Fairgrounds course. A group of dedicated volunteers worked hard through late spring and early summer, pouring the concrete from bags and laying out four hundred feet of hose to bring water to the distant holes. More work parties are planned for this winter to improve course conditions and prepare for future events.

Newberry Hill Heritage Park

Kitsap County has set aside over a thousand acres of land that stretches south from Newberry Hill Road to the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club on the Seabeck Highway. This property surrounds the area where the Klahowya Secondary school now sits. A number of organizations have expressed interest in developing this large plot of land for various recreational activities. The WSDGA was ably represented by President Paul Wright and Cathy Cohoon at the inaugural meeting concerning this issue. Our hope is to secure as much as forty acres of the property and develop it into a world-class disc golf course. We think there will be enough space for a couple of par fours and maybe even a par five length hole.
